Dear Parents:

Thursday, September 10, is the first day of school next year. Our kindergarten children will not all begin on the first day of school--half of our enrollment will begin school on September 10 and the other half will begin on September 11. I hope your child is looking forward to his first day.

The attached slip will tell you which session your child has been assigned to, his beginning date, teacher's name, and room number. Your child will remain in the same session for the entire school year.

The MORNING SESSION of kindergarten begins at 8:50 a.m. and dismisses at 11:20 a.m.

The AFTERNOON SESSION of kindergarten begins at 12:30 p.m. and dismisses at 3:00 p.m.

Please do not send your child to school too early! But it also is as important for the kindergarten pupil to be on time as it is for the older pupils.

This past year we had to give away a huge carton of unclaimed lost-and-found articles. Please use a laundry-marking pen (or name tags) and mark your children's detachable clothes!

Each day the kindergarten children are served milk and cookies. If you do not want your child to participate in this program, please write a note to the teacher so stating.

If you would like to have your child have milk and cookies, the cost is 6¢ a day. The teacher would prefer your paying this by the week, sending 30¢ each MONDAY when there is a full school week, and the appropriate amount whenever the child has missed a day, or school is closed one or more days that week.

If you have any problems, I will be very happy to talk to you. The school office will reopen August 31.
